

## Overview

Naviance Student can help make the process of finding the right college just a little easier. Using Naviance Student's Find your Fit search tools, you can locate the schools that most fit with your interests, passions, and criteria. Once you've narrowed down a group of colleges, multiple tools are available to understand more about that school in general and as a prospect. This document is meant to help you understand how to search for, favorite, and research colleges of interest.

Naviance Student provides two features to store college information:

- **Colleges I'm Thinking About:** This is a list of schools that you have *favorited* and identified as prospective schools of interest.
- **Colleges I'm Applying To:** This is a list of schools to which you have decided to apply. This can be populated from College's I'm Thinking About or directly from searches.


## Find Your Fit Tools

The first step of this process is figuring out what schools may be a good fit for you based on your interests. Naviance Student offers seven (7) search tools – SuperMatch™, College Match, College Events, Scattergrams, Advanced College Search, and College Lookup.

To access Find Your Fit Tools, go to **Colleges**, locate the **Find Your Fit** column, and select the **search tool** of your choice.

### SuperMatch™

Use SuperMatch™ to receive a list of best-fit schools based on criteria that you deem as important in your college search. SuperMatch™ can be used to save searches and return to them later. To learn about the details of using SuperMatch™, please review the **SuperMatch Reference Guide**.

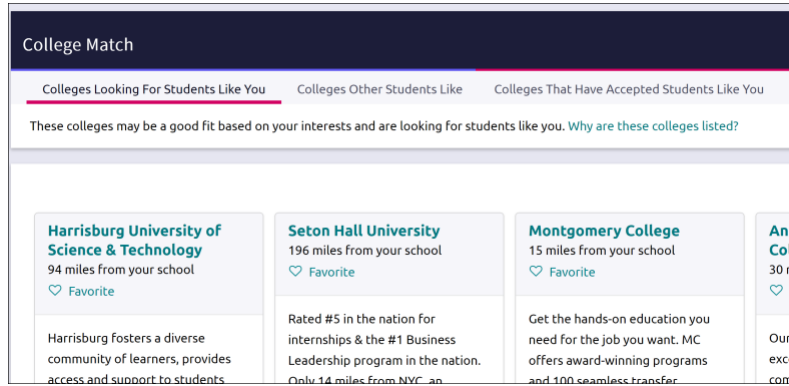

1. **Choose Fit Criteria:** Use best fit criteria drop-downs such as Location and Academics to get matched with the schools that are the best fit for you.

3. **Favorite:** Add schools to the colleges you are thinking about in Naviance Student.
4. **Compare:** Use the Pinned drop-down to Compare pinned schools based on factors important to you.

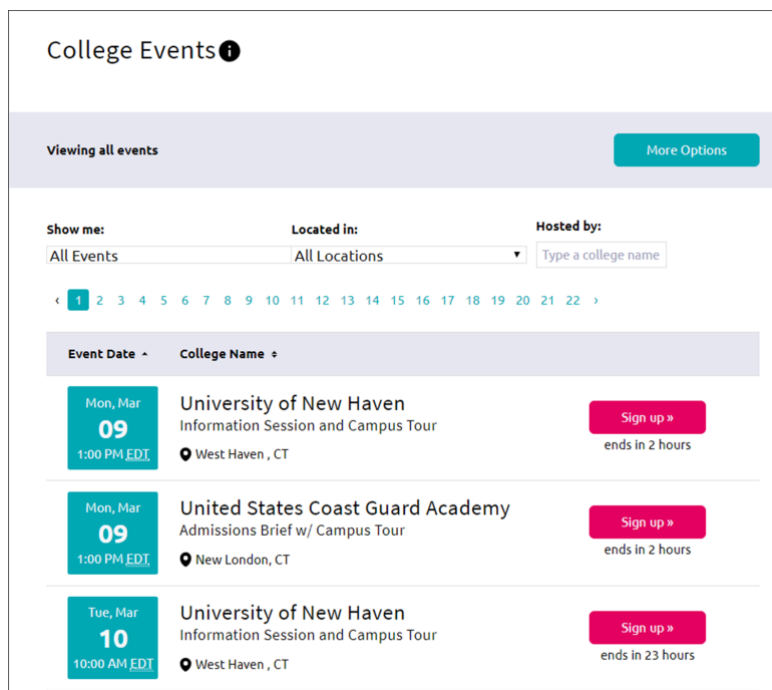

View a list of colleges that are hosting events and sign up for those of interest.

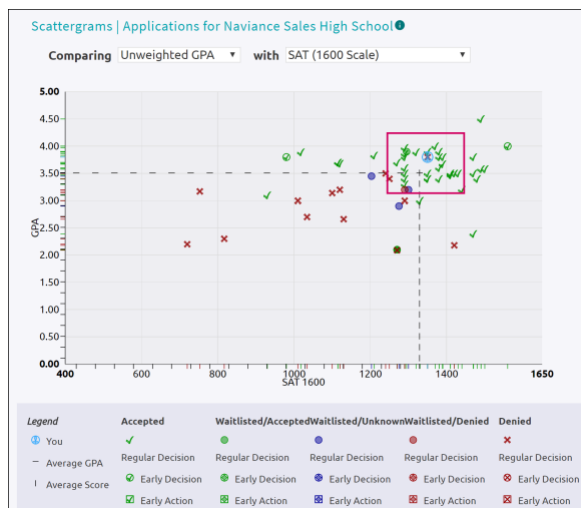
- Browse events and sign up in Naviance Student.

## Scattergrams

A scattergram is a graph used to help you analyze how you fit in with other students from your high school who have been accepted, waitlisted, or denied admittance to a school based on GPA and test scores.

1. Select a **college** from the dropdown list. The number in parentheses shows how many other students from your high school, historically, have applied to this school.
2. Click **View Scattergram**.

3. Change the **Comparing** and **with** dropdown menus to make sure you are comparing the right information.
4. Use the **legend** to view those accepted, waitlisted, and denied. Your data shows as a **light blue circle**. Hover over a data point to see connected SAT and GPA information.



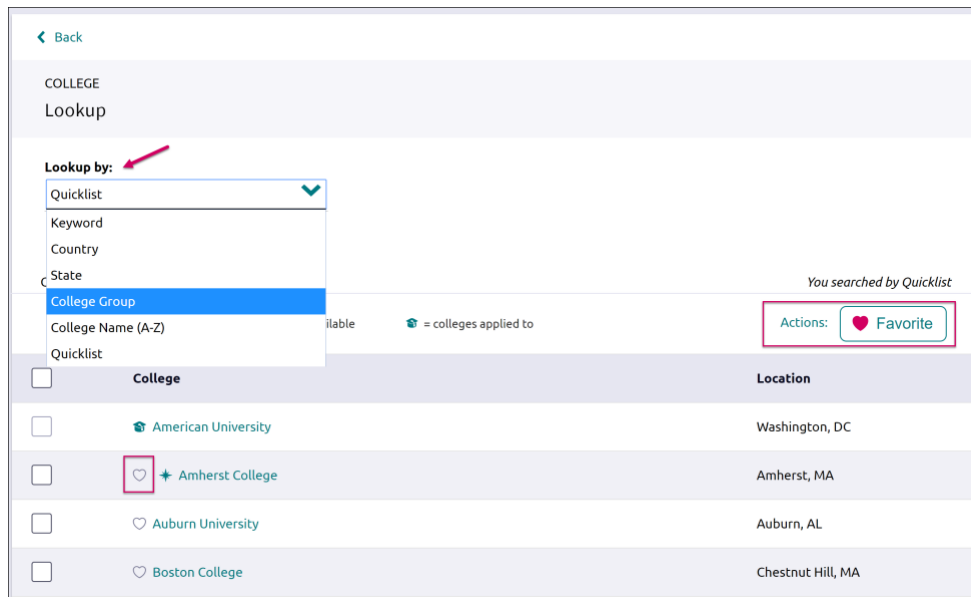
## Advanced College Search

Using multiple categories, answer questions to identify colleges that match your interests.

1. Click on a **category**, i.e., Location or Majors.
2. Answer category-related **questions** and identify your preferences for a school.
3. Click **View Matches**.  
*A list of schools that match your criteria displays.*
4. Click the **checkbox(es)** next to the school(s) depending on what action you want to take next.
5. From here, you can choose to use **Compare Me**, **Add to Colleges I'm Thinking About** (Favorite), **Send an Email** to the school, view a **Scattergram** for the school, or visit the **school's website**.
6. From our results list, click **Save Search** to save this search criteria.
7. Next time you return, go to the **Saved Searches** dropdown menu and find your saved search.

## College Lookup

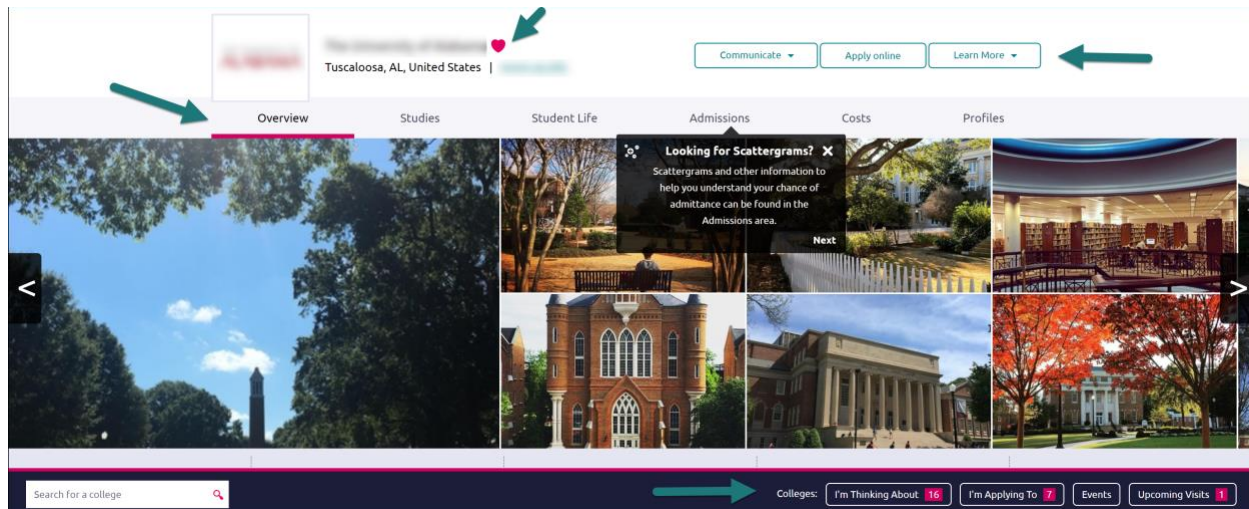
Lookup and favorite school(s) by multiple filters including name, country, state, or college group. Easily favorite using the heart symbol next to the college.



## College Profile Pages

When a search is completed, the schools that are a part of the results can be researched further by accessing the college's profile. From a search result, click the college of interest to open its college profile.

1. Click the **heart icon** to favorite the school and add it to your list of Colleges I'm Thinking About.
2. Use the **tabs** (Overview, Studies, Student Life, etc.) to learn more about these areas.
3. **Communicate, Apply Online, or Learn More** using the provided buttons on the page.
4. Located at the bottom of the page, use the buttons to **navigate** to those areas specified in Naviance Student (Colleges I'm Thinking About, Applying To, etc.).

## College Compare

Add schools to compare the average GPA and test scores of students from your high school that have been accepted to that college over a span of time.

1. Click **Add Colleges to Compare**.
2. Use the **College Lookup** to find schools.
3. Click the **checkbox** (es) next to the schools to which you'd like to see a comparison.
4. Click **Save Selection** in the upper-right corner.
5. Click **Finished Searching**.

*The schools are added to your Compare list. A green check means your numbers are higher and a red x means they are lower than average for those who have been admitted to this school.*

## Acceptance History


An alphabetical list of colleges where someone from your school has been accepted and/or enrolled over a time span.
