Graduation Requirements

To earn a standard high school diploma, you need a minimum of:

- 24 credits
- 2.0 *Unweighted* GPA
- Pass Grade 10 FAST Exam (ELA)
- Pass End-of-Course Math exam Algebra 1 and/or Geometry
- Concordant Scores if necessary
 - SAT and ACT scores

English - 4 credits

Math - 4 credits (Must include Alq 1, Geom)

Science - 3 credits (Must include Biology)

Social Studies - 3.5 credits (World, US, Gov't/Econ, Personal Financial Literacy)

HOPE - 1 credit

Performing Art/CTE - 1 credit

Electives - 7.5 credits

24 Credits required to graduate

Personal Financial Literacy Requirement



- FLVS Yes, course is offered but only standard or honors
- SJR DE Yes, dual enrollment course is ECO 1930 Personal Financial Literacy
- Currently, no AP courses satisfy this requirement
- Students will have 3 half-credit courses for senior year
- PVHS is currently reviewing possible course pairings for this requirement in the senior year.

The HOPE question

- Florida statute requires students to take one (1) credit of physical education in high school, which must include the integration of health. This course requirement can be satisfied when students successfully complete Health Opportunities through Physical Education (HOPE), a one-year course.
- Due to the content, students are encouraged to take the course no earlier than the 3rd quarter of their 8th grade year. The course includes topics such as Mental/Social Health, Alcohol and Drug Prevention, and Internet Safety. Students are eligible to begin the HOPE course upon their first day of the 3rd quarter during their 8th grade school year.
- **If you sign up for HOPE before July, the MIDDLE SCHOOL approves the request

Courses come in 4 sizes

- Standard satisfies all Florida Graduation requirements.
- Honors faster paced and more rigorous than standard.
- Advanced Placement (AP) College level courses. Potential increase in workload, advanced reading and writing, more independent. AP Exam in at the end of the school year in May.
- Dual Enrollment (DE) Actual college courses taken through UNF or SJRSC. Can be virtual, on PVHS campus, or on the college campus. DE can be taken starting in 10th grade.

STANDARD COURSES: SM1 (50% Q1, 50% Q2), SM2 (50% Q3, 50% Q4)

COURSES WITH A DISTRICT FINAL EXAM: 45% Q1, 45% Q2, 10% EXAM

COURSES WITH AN EOC: 17.5% Q1, 17.5% Q2, 17.5%Q3, 17.5% Q4, 30% EOC. NO SEMESTER GRADES, ONLY FINAL GRADE (ALG 1, GEOM, USH, BIOLOGY)

DUAL ENROLLMENT (DE): ONE FINAL GRADE PROVIDED BY THE COLLEGE

AP COURSES FOLLOW STANDARD COURSES GRADING PROCEDURES. AP EXAM DOES NOT HAVE EFFECT ON GRADE.

Honors/Accelerated Criteria - SJCSD

- A student currently enrolled in an Honors/Accelerated course is eligible to continue
 placement in an honors course if he/she has earned a Level 4 or 5 on State Assessments
 and at least a C in current honors/accelerated course.
- A student currently enrolled in a standard level course is eligible for placement in an honors
 course if he/she has earned a Level 4 or 5 on State Assessments or earned an A in current
 standard course.
- A student earning a Level 3 on a State Assessment can be considered for placement in an honors course if he/she has historical data to support placement or has received administrative recommendation.



What is Virtual Lab and Blended?

<u>Virtual Lab</u> - Student takes a virtual course on campus in a lab that is monitored by a staff member.

<u>Blended Schedule</u> - Student takes full course load (7 credits). A combination of in-person on-campus courses and off-campus courses virtually. Must have minimum of 4 classes on campus.

Registration Procedures

- Students who currently attend a St. Johns County middle school:
 - Student Course Verification letters and registration procedures, will be sent home mid-February
 - Letter includes date and time and other helpful information
- Students must bring their BLUE student verification letter and elective course selection sheets completed and <u>signed by a</u> <u>parent</u> to register.
- Not in SJCSD yet? PVHS Guidance Department will contact you to set up your course selection appointment AFTER enrollment is completed online. Enrollment opens on March 1.

Registration Tips

- Select 6 Elective Courses in order of preference. All 6 electives will not be on the student's schedule, but we cannot guarantee the first-choice elective.
- Students should NOT choose an elective they absolutely do not want... they could get it!
- Back to school orientation information will be shared in the early summer.
- First Day of High School is August 11.

Remember...

- Make course selections carefully based on student's strengths.
- DO NOT OVERLOAD!!!
- It is important to take challenging courses but also be realistic when considering all obligations.
- Virtual options are available to students during the school day.
- Remember that the master schedule is built, and teachers are hired, based on course requests.
- Changes once the school year has started may NOT be possible. Schedule changes mid-year are not permitted.
