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Graduation Requirements

To earn a standard high school diploma, you need a minimum of:

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- **24 credits**
- **2.0 Unweighted GPA**
- **Pass Grade 10 FAST ELA exam**
- **Pass End-of-Course exam** Algebra 1 and/or Geometry
- **Must take 1 online course** HOPE satisfies this requirement

24 Credits

- **English** – 4 credits
- **Math** – 4 credits (Must include Alg 1, Geom)
- **Science** – 3 credits (Must include Biology)
- **Social Studies** – 3 credits (World, US, Gov't/Eco)
- **HOPE** – 1 credit
- **Performing Art** – 1 credit
- **Elective** - 8 credits

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Courses come in 4 sizes

- Standard
- Honors – faster paced and more rigorous than standard.
- Advanced Placement (AP) – College level courses. Potential increase in workload, advanced reading and writing, more independent. AP Exam in May.
- Dual Enrollment (DE) – Actual College courses taken through UNF or SJRSC. Can be virtual or on PVHS campus, or on the College campus. DE can be taken starting in 10th grade.

Grades

- Standard courses – SM1 (50% Q1, 50% Q2), SM2 (50% Q3, 50% Q4)

- Courses with a district Final exam – 45% Q1, 45% Q2, 10% Exam
- Courses with an EOC – 17.5% Q1, 17.5% Q2, 17.5%Q3, 17.5% Q4, 30% EOC. NO SEMESTER GRADES, only final grade (Alg 1, Geom, USH, Biology)
- Dual Enrollment (DE) –One final grade provided by the college
- AP courses – follow Standard courses grading procedures. AP exam DOES NOT have effect on grade.

Honors courses – 4.5 scale

AP Courses – 5.0 scale

Academic Questions/Concerns

Step 1 – ***Student*** should schedule an appropriate time to talk with teacher about concern.

Step 2 (if not resolved) – ***Parent*** emails teacher to discuss question/concern

Step 3 (if not resolved) – ***Student*** makes an appointment with School Counselor to discuss question/concern.

Step 4 (if not resolved) – ***Parent*** emails School Counselor to discuss question/concern.

Step 5 (if not resolved) – ***Parent*** emails Assistant Principal to discuss question/concern.



Blended vs. Modified

Blended schedule –underclass students takes a combination of seven courses in person on campus *and* virtually.

Students can take the virtual course on campus in a monitored computer lab, or off campus.

Modified Schedule – **Seniors** are allowed to take less than 7 credits **IF** they are on pace for graduation at the end of their Junior year.

Change a level of a course procedure –

- To keep the courses recommended, make no marks and fill out the bottom of the sheet.

Students meet individually with their alpha school counselor **WITH THE COMPLETED, SIGNED, RECOMMENDATION SHEET.**

Course recommendation sheet **must** be completed and signed by a parent/guardian. **Student will not have a registration appointment until it is.**

Registration Tips

- Please choose 6 Elective Course Selections in order of preference. You will not have all 6 electives on your schedule, but we cannot guarantee your first choice elective.
- Don't choose an elective you absolutely don't want, you could get it!
- Summer reading lists available in May
- Back to school orientation, more info. to follow
- Remember first day of school August 10

Remember...

- Make course selections carefully based on your strengths.

- Virtual options are available to students during the school day.
- It is important to challenge yourself ***but also be realistic*** when considering all of your obligations.
- Remember that the master schedule is built, and teachers are hired, based on your course requests.
- Changes once the school year has started may NOT be possible.

Random Info

- ❖ School begins at 9:15am – 3:50pm (Wednesday = 2:50pm)

- ❖ School access at 8:30am, including Media Center and breakfast
- ❖ Passing periods = 5 minutes
- ❖ Restrooms and water fountains in each building

The HOPE question -

Florida statute requires students to take one (1) credit of physical education in high school, which must include the integration of health. This course requirement can be satisfied when students successfully complete Health Opportunities through Physical Education (HOPE), a one-year course.

Due to the content, students are encouraged to take the course no earlier than the 3rd quarter of their 8th grade year. The course includes topics such as Mental/Social Health, Alcohol and Drug Prevention, and Internet Safety. Students are eligible to begin the HOPE course upon their first day of the 3rd quarter during their 8th grade school year.

****If you sign up for HOPE before July, the MIDDLE SCHOOL approves the request**

Students who earn an AICE or IB diploma are exempt from the HOPE graduation requirement. (Alternative options can be found in the High School Student Progression Plan on page 34)


