Course Content

Topics for this course are defined by the College Board and correlated with the Florida Sunshine State Standards. The Calculus AB exam covers differential and integral calculus topics that are typically included in introductory calculus courses at the college level. Calculus is the culmination of all the mathematics students have done in high school. In May, the Advanced Placement Exam will be given. If student successfully passes the exam they may, depending on their grade and the college of their choice, receive college credit for Calculus I.
